

Guidelines for Oral Poster Presentation

Structure

- **Two-Part Presentation:**
 - **Oral Component:** A concise, "snapshot" oral presentation.
 - **Total time:** 5 minutes (4 minutes for speaking, 1 minute for Q&A).
 - **Number of slides:** Maximum of 7, including the title and concluding slides.
 - **Content:** Clearly outline aims, methodology, and key results.
 - **Purpose:** Encourage audience to visit the corresponding poster display for extended discussion.
 - **Poster Component:** An e-poster, created as per the dedicated e-poster guidelines.

Slide & Content Requirements

- Use clear and simple slides, minimizing dense text or complicated graphics.
- Ensure each slide addresses a single point or dataset.
- Cover these sections in your oral component:
 - Introduction
 - Objectives
 - Methods
 - Results
 - Discussion
 - Conclusions

Technical Details

- **Slide Format:** PowerPoint (.ppt/.pptx), landscape orientation, adhere to platform requirements for resolution if specified.

- The e-poster accompanying the oral presentation must follow the scientific committee's e-poster formatting rules (typically a single slide, specific resolution, presenter anonymity)^[2].

Additional Guidelines

- Presenters should be ready at their designated session with their uploaded presentations.
- Certificates of presentation will be given at the session's end.
- Time limits will be strictly observed.

Judging and Display

- After the oral presentations, authors are encouraged to engage in further discussions at their poster stations
